

Display Board/Presentation Evaluation

DISPLAY BOARD/PRESENTATION POINTS

_____ Title (2 points)

The title should be clear and in font and size that is easily read. The title of the project is the judge's first impression and should give a clear indication of the project. Your **name and school should NOT be on the display board or papers that you have displayed with you project.**

_____ Objective and hypothesis *** (5 points)

_____ Project Summary*** (5 points)

_____ Detailed Data/Logbook (15 points)

If you choose to re-type your logbook for your display, for neatness purposes, the original book should be placed at the display for the judges to see.

_____ Two or more graphs showing results (4 points)

Keep in mind that space is limited on the board. If you have many graphs for your project, consider placing the two or three that best show your results and place the rest in a binder for the judges to view.

_____ Conclusion or summary of conclusion (4 points)

The conclusion and summary should be a brief over-view of the sections from the project paper to give the judges a glimpse into how the project was conducted and the knowledge gained.

_____ Creativity and Neatness (5 points)

The presentation board is for the judges, not for you. Please keep any extra decoration to a minimum. Pictures of you doing the project or of the project itself are great additions to the board. ANYTHING that is placed on the board should add to the presentation - not distract.

_____ Presentation (25 points)

*** These items should be copies directly from the project paper and placed on the board so that they are easily read. (Be careful of the font type and size. Just because it may look neat and nice on the board does not mean that a judge is going to find it easily read.)
